Brightening The Outlook for Young Patients & Families in RACH Medical Ward



Thanks to a very generous donation, in recognition of the wonderful care and treatment delivered to a young oncology patient, we have been able to fund significant improvements within the medical ward at RACH. This includes new reclining chairs in each of the rooms, to help make the long hours that parents spend sitting by their child's bedside as comfortable as possible. We have also funded new blinds on the doors into each of the rooms, which can be carefully raised by nursing staff to check on patients overnight without disrupting the child or parent's precious sleep. Best of all, the colours chosen by nursing staff are bright and uplifting, bringing some much needed cheer to the ward.

#### Scholarly Support For Archie Delivers Win-Win-Win Results

Retired school teacher, Anne, has been a long standing supporter of The Archie Foundation. Her first donation was in 2012 when she donated funds raised at a birthday celebration, but it was in 2020 that she struck on a really novel way to fundraise for the charity. One tailor made for teachers! Anne had helped each of her grandchildren study for their school exams so when a friend asked if she would tutor her child, Anne was only too happy to help. But on one condition - no fee, just a donation to Archie. Anne recently took the difficult decision to retire for a second time and does so with the great pride of three-fold success. Firstly, through her tutoring Anne raised a whopping £1,700 to help the children and families Archie is here for. Secondly, she has helped 17 children (like Zara) to ace their school exams, with many going on to study at university. The icing on the cake is the personal joy and happiness Anne gained from helping others. We are so grateful to Anne for her amazing support and would love nothing more than to see fellow school teachers take inspiration from Anne and follow her lead!



It's Never Too Early To Start Fundraising For The Archie Foundation!



Two year old Andrew and his family had a very special motivation to fundraise for Archie. They wanted to say thank you for the support received from the charity last year when Andrew became very unwell during a visit to his Granny in Orkney. He had to be airlifted to Royal Aberdeen Children's Hospital where he spent a week in the high dependency unit. It was a really scary time for the whole family but Archie was here for them all and we're delighted to report that Andrew made a full recovery, so much so that he was able to complete a 1.5km walk around the Peedie Sea in Orkney in April this year, raising a fantastic £785 for Archie!

Distraction, Focus and Fun for Children Requiring X-Ray at RACH

When the X-Ray rooms in RACH were recently refurbished, the team approached Archie to ask for support in adding finishing touches that in their line of work are much more than "extras". Local artist and generous Archie patron, Johanna Basford, worked closely with the team to understand how their needs differed from the previous work she had undertaken for us. In particular the designs needed to be bigger and bolder, with elements for children to find, count or describe. As well as presenting a welcoming environment, being able to focus on certain elements helps calm anxious children (and parents!), reducing fidgeting and helping our X-ray colleagues capture clear images quickly and easily which is good for patients and good for staff.



## Funding Specialist Equipment for Young Patients and Their Families



In recent months we have funded a number of travel aids to support children with additional needs, including specialist prams for children like Paisley who leave hospital still on oxygen. Paisley was diagnosed with Down Syndrome before birth. She was eager to explore everything the world has to offer and made an early appearance at 31 weeks and 1 day, however Paisley had a long journey before she was able to go home. She spent 9 months in hospital including trips to Glasgow and underwent a total of 11 visits to theatre. Even when finally strong enough to go home, Paisley still requires to be on oxygen. That means carrying a lot of kit with her 24/7, too much for a standard pram. Archie helped fund a suitable pram that can carry all Paisley's equipment and her mum, Lynne, couldn't be more grateful, telling us that "this pram has been a lifesaver for us and makes going out so much easier." #### Works Continue At Pace On The New Baird Family Hospital

I'm surprised on a daily basis by the pace of progress being made on this colossal build. Most of the hoardings surrounding the site have now been removed and the area around the hospital is being landscaped, with new access roads and paths being built and even planting now underway in the entrance courtyard. Commissioning works are expected to begin next summer and our "Baird Appeal" continues in readiness for this. We can't wait to see inside!



**Bilicocoons Deliver The Difference for Babies at Aberdeen Neonatal Unit** 



We may have to wait for the Baird but already we're making the difference for neonatal babies and their families. Archie's support for neonatal services is constant and thanks to generous donations we were able to fund two "BiliCocoons" for Aberdeen Maternity Hospital, which are already in use. Phototherapy treatment is generally delivered by stripping babies down to their nappy and placing them directly on a cot under lights - not surprisingly babies often become very unsettled which is distressing for everyone involved.

These phototherapy blankets mean babies can benefit from skin-to-skin bonding, comforting and even feeding all while continuing to receive vital treatment. We were thrilled to receive such positive feedback and thanks, which explains so much better than we ever could the difference your support means in real terms for babies, parents and staff. Mini Massage Sessions to Say Thank You to Hard Working NHS Staff on International Nurses Day





Introducing Archie Support for Neonatal Families at NHS Tayside's NICU
